

Using our Groups


Registration

The registration process is simple. Go to groups.fm4f.org, enter your email address in the registration form and check your inbox. To ensure that the groups remain a place for professional filmmakers, we will review your registration and activate your account within a few minutes to a few days.

Spaces


The Groups use a concept called Spaces to categories posts depending on their topic. You can think of them as groups like on certain other social networks.

To see a list of all available spaces, press the **Directory** button in the navigation bar.





1. Select the correct category above the map
2. Press the button **add a new entry** on the map
3. Briefly describe what the entity does and how it can help productions be more sustainable.
4. Entities that have signed [our statement](#) should have a **#filmmakers4future** tag.


5. Branches of companies should have a **#branch** tag.
6. You can add as many additional tags as you wish, but make sure that the default tags are preserved.



Using the Knowledge Hub

Concept
